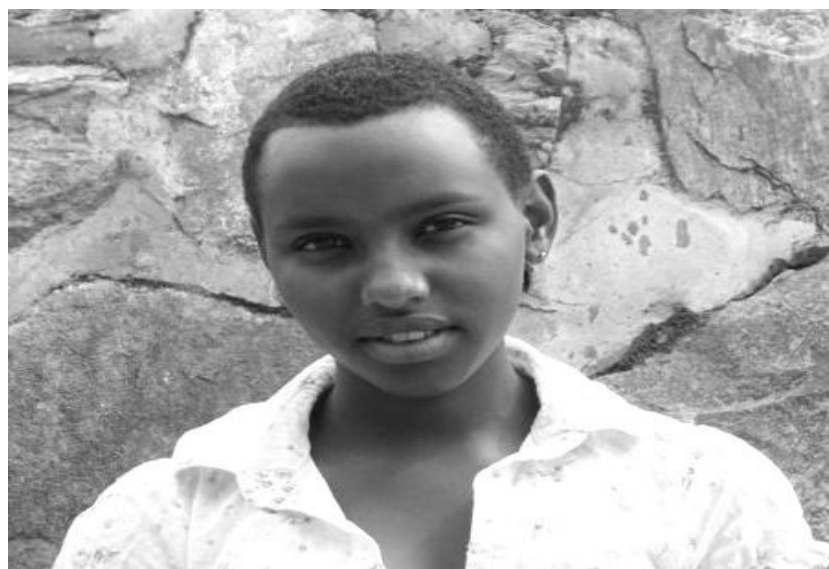

News from Emmanuel

I have seen your email saying that you are vacating the Church building this month, our prayers are with you and God never fails his faithful servants. May God be with you in this transition time.

These last ten days, I was in Rwanda, I came back last night. I was able to visit Arlene and the orphanage. I toured the whole place and I went to the water project. Now from the pictures you have posted to me, the tanks on the water collection from the bottom hill are over and in some places there are pipes, Arlene told me that they are waiting panel solars to come. It is a good project and the people around that hill will benefit so much.

The orphanage is so good; Arlene has a big plan about the school, now she is running a pre-nursery school, a nursery School and a Primary. She told me that she is planning to open a secondary school very soon and a University in ten years time (A woman with a big vision at late age, God can use anybody any time!!).

Apart from the school there are some rearing animal projects, there are chickens, rabbits, goats, pigs, and cows to support the children and staff in meals and also to teach the population around to do similar activities to provide good food for their children and also as income projects to their families.

Arlene has acquired a big land and still buying more for the big plan she has, the place is very well placed in the heart of the town and people around are appreciating her effort.

She was a bit disappointed because I have not taken a group of students with me because of the tiny program we were having it was not possible for this trip, but I promised her that next time I will take them there and I believe some of them will come back to work with her as interns and volunteers. (The next trip will be in April next year).

About the tailoring and shoe repair projects, she told me that it is not in her plan, what I think she may be interested in is to buy a cow to the children.

I'm going to send to you the youth project report from Cyangugu very soon and the way forward for the project.

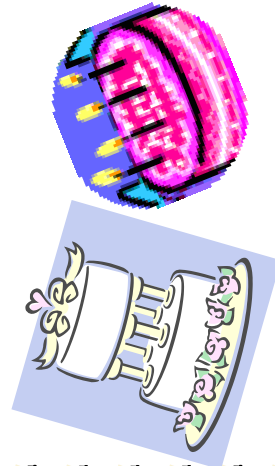
